



Family Camp Guide

Arrival

When you arrive, your family will be greeted by a staff member. The staff member will check your paperwork and confirm your cottage assignment and direct you to its location.

Cottage Assignments

Each Family will be assigned to a cottage unless otherwise notified. Cottage assignments are on a first come first serve basis. The cottages will house one family each unless multiple families request cottage sharing. Each cottage consists of single size bunk beds (enough for 12 people). You will need to bring your own linens.

Tent Camping

We have plenty of space for families to set up their own tents if preferred.

Campers / RV's

Families are welcome to bring their Campers / RV's. Limited electrical hook up is available on a first come first serve basis.

Meals

Breakfast on Saturday through breakfast on Sunday will be provided.

Tentative Schedule

Friday

Saturday

- 9am Breakfast
- 9am-12pm Activity Session – All activities are by choice and optional. (You will have the opportunity Friday night to sign up for the activities you would like to participate in)
- 12:30 – Lunch / Down time
- 1:30-5:30 Activity Session – All activities are by choice and optional. (You will have the opportunity during lunch to sign up for the activities you would like to participate in)
- 6pm – Dinner
- 7-9pm – Evening Activities – All optional
- 9-10:30 – Camp Fire / Songs / Smores

Sunday

- 8:30 – Breakfast
- 11am – Departure – see you at the next family camp! 😊

Safety While at Camp

Water Front

- Anyone on a boat or dock must wear a life jacket at ALL times
- Anyone under the age of 18 must wear a life jacket if swimming, within the designated swim area, at the water front.
- No one under the age of 13 is allowed on the water front without an adult supervisor. Meet other families and share this responsibility! ☺
- No swimming or boating without a lifeguard on duty. See schedule for available times.

Pool

- Anyone under the age of 18 must pass a swim test to go into the deep end. We will provide a wrist band for those who pass.
- Anyone under the age of 13 must be accompanied by an adult supervisor. Again, meet other families and share this responsibility! ☺
- No swimming without a lifeguard on duty. See schedule for available times.
- Follow pool rules at all times.

General Camp Rules

- YMCA Camp Kekoka is an alcohol and drug free camp area. Alcohol consumption on camp property is prohibited.
- Please follow the YMCA core character values of Honesty, Caring, Responsibility, and Respect while attending Family Camp.
- Please no pets allowed during family camp.
- Camp fires can only happen at the camp fire circle.

Departure

Since we will have campers arriving on Sunday for the following week of camp we ask that families be completely out of their cottages by 11:00am. Each family is responsible for cleaning their cottage. Staff will come by to check you out of your cottage please speak with staff prior to departure.
